Angelina went to her first foster home at the age of 6. She was placed in 45 homes after that, before she came to Kemmerer Village.

FOSTERING THE **FUTURE**

Every 100 seconds a child in America leaves their family entering the foster care system. Foster care is simply defined as a temporary living situation for children whose parents are unable, unwilling or unfit to care for them.

The number of children in need of these temporary safe places continues to rise. On any given day in the United States, there are 437,465 children in foster care. This number has grown 3% in 2018. These shocking national statistics are why Kemmerer Village answered the call helping children and families to care for those in need. Our Foster Care program is growing everyday out of need. This year the number of foster care children Kemmerer Village has taken responsibility for has grown nearly 200 percent. These children are in need of a safe home due to neglect, abuse, and the growing drug problem plaguing our county. The needs of these children and the families involved are great. Many children in foster care are fortunate enough to go to homes of relatives. However, there is still a tremendous need for traditional foster homes.

Volunteering At KEMMERER VILLAGE

Bonnie is a volunteer at Kemmerer Village working with Equine Therapist Amber Miller. Bonnie has been volunteering with the program for two years. She became familiar with horses volunteering with her church mission team. After a short time working in the Equine Program, Bonnie has taken a leadership role. She shares her knowledge and experience of horses with the children at Kemmerer Village. The youth participate in an early morning work program caring for the horses. They also assist as side walkers in the community program Horses and Heroes which takes place in the spring and

fall at the Kemmerer Village arena. Bonnie helps the Kemmerer Village youth build knowledge performing activities with the horses such as handling the horses: how to lead the horse, back the horse up and have the horse stand at the mounting block. These skills are necessary for Kemmerer youth to acquire while assisting as side walkers for the community service program Horses and Heroes. Bonnie coaches the residents and helps build their confidence on how to interact with the young riders with disabilities who benefit from this program. The side walkers are taught how to reassure and encourage the riders.

When asked what horse is her favorite Bonnie responded "that would be Oreo, who Kemmerer Village won in the second Facebook Gypsy voting contest. She is my favorite because she is so sweet, I mean after all she is an Oreo." Bonnie's time volunteering has improved her people skills, as well as leadership abilities and communication skills. Bonnie added to her working and volunteering schedule by taking a college course, hopefully to continue in an area related to the experience she has acquired at Kemmerer Village. For now Bonnie continues to volunteer with Kemmerer Village Equine Program.
