A BOOK IS A GIFT THAT LASTS A LIFETIME

This winter, Kemmerer Village was blessed with approximately 600 books, for children of all ages! One of our Foster Families celebrated the adoption of two of their children by hosting a book drive. Kemmerer families are a wonderful part of our Village and we are thrilled they opened up to tell their story.

"My husband and I always had a pull on our hearts to become foster parents and we took the leap and started the licensing process in spring of 2018. That fall, just weeks after we got our license, we said yes to our first placement. We understood the purpose and plan for foster care and realized the likelihood of adopting was slim, but we were open to that if the opportunity ever arose. Our desire was to welcome kids into our home, help them connect, grow, and know they are loved whether it was for a little while or forever. One of the easiest ways for us to connect with the littles was by reading stories.

The oldest of the two placed with us was 2 when first arriving and she quickly showed interest in the few, bright Children's books we had. As winter approached, the library became a favorite place. One day I remember reading 30 minutes straight before she hopped down and wanted to play. Her little brother soon picked up interest as well and would often grab books and just flip through the pages in between storytime. Fast forward 3 years on this journey and they both joined our family forever in 2021. After the adoptions, my husband and I talked about ways we could share the joy and outpouring these two brought us, and books just made sense. We began a book drive for other foster care youth still in care hoping a book in their hands would offer a time of connection with them and their foster family. I wish I had counted exactly how many books we dropped off but it was enough to fill the entire back row and trunk of our minivan. I pray the kids who get handed those books will be as full of wonder as ours were and that this will cultivate a love of reading in lots of little hearts. Foster kids go through so much and allowing them to step into a good book and stir the imagination is priceless."

Again, as I consider the work by Kemmerer Village supervisors and administrative teams with application review and interviews, my heart is full. We are moving forward with strong hiring trends, although we still need several more staff to completely fulfill the needs of all Kemmerer Village kids and families. I want to reach out to our community partners, offering professional fulfillment, fun, and joy to those who aren't aware of our broad range of employment opportunities.

Actively linking with our community partners is a key component of my 2022 goals. We are seeking speaking opportunities to share our joy and to offer fulfillment. I am hopeful that Kemmerer Village representatives, including me, can again share the wonderful Kemmerer Village happenings with Churches, Community groups, and in individuals' homes. Horses are Model Therapy

Kemmerer's equine-facilitated psychotherapy program draws from the Natural Lifemanship model of therapy. This facilitates a process whereby children are able to address and move through past or present damaging life circumstances. It helps them understand how those circumstances affect their current interactions and make the personal changes necessary for healthy fulfilling relationships.

We help our clients to build real relationships with our horses and explore what that means in terms of attachment and connected detachment. Survivors of trauma have many hurdles socially that can be explored well when discussing the behaviors of a prey animal like a horse.

Everyone knows that playing sports has many physical benefits; enhanced aerobic fitness, weight management, lower blood pressure, enhanced cardiovascular health, improved strength, and endurance, etc. However, at Kemmerer Village, we focus on the therapeutic benefits of sports, and we take that a step further by also focusing on good sportsmanship.

For the youth that we serve, sports are a very important part of their treatment program. Many of the things they struggle with, such as - depression, lack of focus, low self-esteem, irritability, following directions — can be directly aided by being part of a sports team. Our youth learn their value as part of a team. They learn to work together and respect authority, and leadership skills that many haven't had the opportunity to learn during their difficult lives. Also, physical activity is proven to improve mood, concentration, sleep habits, and reduce stress; all attributes which benefit our kids.


When we throw sportsmanship into the mix, the benefits are increased. Our youth learn to encourage each other, help the underdog, and focus on the positive aspects of all team members instead of just focusing on winning. These are great life lessons that are sometimes missing in our current society. We stress to our children that while it's nice to win, it's nicer to be a good person to all around you. We teach them to try harder if they lose instead of giving up. We teach them to smile and shake hands whether they've won or lost because the true winners are the good people of this world. And we teach them that whether you've won or lost, you are WORTHY and IMPORTANT to your team.

We pray that the life lessons we instill here at Kemmerer Village through our sports and recreation program will help our children for years to come and make the world a better place one child at a time.
